The "Get on Board" campaign explored painting curbs to increase visibility. Previous efforts used yellow paint; however, recent testing of blue, white, yellow, red, and orange showed that blue provided the best contrast.		
Feedback on the blue curb has been mixed. So far, one curb has been painted blue, with more planned. Yellow paint was determined to lack sufficient contrast with concrete. The blue curbs aim to assist visually impaired individuals.		
The group is researching transit curb color standards and will install tactile facilities. A site walk with CNIB is scheduled for Friday to conduct further testing. Previous testing involved visually impaired employees and transit.
