3.1 <u>Elections Edmonton and Accessibility</u>	C.Heywood & J. Nutbrown presented to AAC regarding Edmonton Elections and Accessibility.

#### Questions from AAC:

Describe the lessons learned from the federal election in terms of processes?

- Examined best practices in all levels of government
- Not enough time passed since the most recent election to examine the data
- Proud of commitment to accessibility, tangible operational changes
- Need to address less tangible strategies, training, voter experience, etc.

Strategies to include the houseless in accessibility for voting?

- Constrained by provincial legislation
- Limited to attestation of elector's address, cannot attest to the identity of an elector anymore
- Plan to increase communications to community groups providing services to houseless electors
- Potential solution offering voting station at a downtown location and providing information through shelters

Will there be ASL interpreters provided during debates, meetings, etc?

Is there a number we can text or email for transportation instead of making a phone call? Voting stations - can electors bring support workers? Will there be an ASL interpreter available? Will it be advertised that there is an ASL interpreter available?

- Limited understanding in this area
- Aware this is a barrier
- Provide information to candidates to support best practices - can ensure events are accessible and inclusive but are required to

	remain impartial and ethical  - Uncertain if there is a text number for transportation - will find out  - ASL interpreter would have to be requested - would do our best to coordinate those services. Aware putting the responsibility on the elector is not ideal, will work on making it more accessible
3.2 Affordable Housing Guidebook	C. Etmanksi presented the Affordable Housing Guidebook.
	Looking for feedback by June 16th - Looking to publish by the end of June.
	Will there be a one pager or newsletter style to get attention? - Not in the plan
	Page 9 - definition of accessibility. Missing TBI group - their needs are different (ex. unit flatness but option of a bathtub, or cognitive disability, lighting can be an issue).  - We take developers into the apartments but also the common spaces  - Will add this consideration to page 9 in the definitions
	Vision loss - support people with strokes and vision loss, agree with the lighting comment as it is usually overlooked.
	How do the units get filled? How are they advertised? How do viewings take place? Hard to find accessible units for people who need it. People do not always understand what "accessible" means.  - Could add myth about advertising and where it is posted etc. in the myth section
	Is there an idea for a video based system or flashing lights for alarms? Lights for stairwells, emergency phone in elevators, etc.  - There is a section for

wayfinding breaking down stairwells etc. - Interested in receiving more information that can be added on this topic

Asked to define parameters.  Exclusion of mileage - does not account for accessible vehicles. Requires further conversation as it was not written into the policy.
