Bear Spray - Transaction Recording Example

Directions:

- 1. Fill out the date, time, customer's name, and select the type of identification they have used to purchase the bear spray.
- 2. Record either the customer's identification number (e.g. driver's licence number) or date of birth both do not need to be recorded.
- 3. Check the box to confirm you are selling to a customer over 18 years of age.
- 4. Description of the can of OC spray at minimum, the serial or registration number and brand name must be recorded. If there is no serial or registration number, record other identifying markings instead such as the colour and size.
- 5. Fill out the manufacturer name this column and the previous description column can be prefilled if your store only sells one brand of bear spray.
- 6. Fill out the quantity sold, employee name or employee number as long as the employee number can be tied back to the person who sold it.
- 7. These records contain sensitive personal information keep the records secure and only accessible to those that are authorized and selling bear spray. Keep the records for 24 months.
