Centre City Area Report

September 2023





Study Background and Objectives

In March 2023, the City of Edmonton conducted a survey to understand Edmontonians' experiences of visiting, or living in, the Centre City Area. The survey was distributed to the City's Edmonton Insight Community through a mixed-topic survey, as well as via an open link on the City's website. A total of 2,871 respondents completed the survey (The March Mixed Topic Report can be found HERE).

In September 2023, the same survey was conducted again via the same channels, this time through a single topic survey, to monitor possible changes and improve experiences within the Centre City Area.

Results of both the September 2023 study and the March 2022 study are included in this report.

Research Objectives and Methodology

- Research objectives
 - Provide opportunity to provide feedback on Edmontonians' experiences of visiting, or living in, Edmonton's Centre City Area
 - Understand Edmontonians' downtown lived experiences; and
 - Monitor possible changes and improve experiences within the Centre City Area.
- Research methodology
 - Similar to the March 2023 survey, the 2023 survey was distributed to the City's Insight Community, this time through a single topic survey, as well as via an open link on the City's website.
 - The survey was conducted between September 07 19, 2023. A total of 4,764 respondents completed the survey, 119 of which participated in the survey via an open link.

Statement of limitations: As an online survey with a non-probability sample, and in accordance with industry standards, a margin of error can not be applied.



Participation in Previous Centre City Area Study in March






Q1. Did you participate in the March 2023 Mixed Topic survey on the Centre City Area? Base: All respondents (N=4,746)

Usage of the Centre City Area - Tracking


- Three-quarters of Centre City Area visits are from downtown patterns of destinations remain steady since March.
- 85% visited Centre City Area in the last 12 months (vs. 79% in March 2023).





Activities Conducted in the Centre City Area - Tracking

 Among the survey respondents who have used Centre City Area in the last 12 months, eight in ten participate in social activities when visiting Centre City Area - only about four in ten say they work in the Centre City Area.






Q3. In the last 12 months, what activities have you conducted in the Centre City Area? (select all that apply) Base: Those who have visited Centre City Area in the last 12 months

Frequency of Visitation at the Centre City Area - Tracking

• Among those who have used Centre City Area in the last 12 months, six in ten visit at least once per week (57%) - a five points increase since March.






Q4. In the last 12 months, how often are you in the Centre City Area? Base: Those who have visited Centre City Area in the last 12 months

Most Common Times at the Centre City Area - Tracking

• When asked about the most common times in the Centre City Area in the last 12 months, 75% visit during afternoon hours, between 12pm to 5pm. 56% visit between 5pm to 9pm (50%), with similar proportion visiting in the morning from 7am to noon (55%).Only about two in ten use the Centre City Area later than 9pm (22%).






Q5. What time are you most commonly in the Centre City Area? (select all that apply) Base: Those who have visited Centre City Area in the last 12 months

Experiences with the Centre City Area

- 78% agree that cleanliness affect their feelings of safety,
- 62% are willing to spend more time in the Centre City area if it were cleaner,
- Just under one quarter (20%), agree that the Centre City Area is clean and well maintained



Experiences with the Centre City Area - Tracking

• While Feelings of Safety (21%) and Cleanliness (20%) have declined, seasonality of homeless and transient population may be masking the results of our efforts to make the Downtown more welcoming. (Homelessness is more visible in Sept vs. March)



Satisfaction with Services in the Centre City Area

• About one-half are satisfied with horticulture as well as lawn maintenance (51% and 49%, respectively), and more than one-third are satisfied with how active pathways and sidewalks are maintained (36%).



• Compared to March survey, satisfaction with services in the Centre City Area remains at the same level.



Importance of Improvements in the Centre City Area


 Majority of survey respondents feel it's important to improve litter pick up (94%), garbage collection (93%), roadway and active pathway/sidewalk maintenance (85% and 83%, respectively).


Maintenance and Operations Services in the Centre City Area - Word Cloud
