Dawson Bridge Rehabilitation

Beginning in mid-to-late November 2025, the City of Edmonton will start rehabilitation work on Dawson Bridge, located along Rowland Road between Riverdale and Forest Heights. The project will address structural wear and extend the bridge's service life to ensure it remains safe and functional for years to come. Construction is expected to continue through winter and be completed in spring 2026.

Construction details

Work will begin with the installation of scaffolding around the bridge piers starting in mid-November 2025. This scaffolding will be installed using a barge launched on the North Saskatchewan River and will have no impact on bridge traffic. Once scaffolding is in place, crews will complete:

- Structural steel and concrete inspection
- Pier strengthening and crack repairs
- Drilling and abutment repairs

The abutment work is planned for early 2026. At that time, the bridge will operate as a single-lane alternating roadway for approximately a month. Flaggers and other traffic control measures will be in place to manage traffic.

Access

- Rehabilitation work is not expected to affect access to the Riverside Golf Course or nearby trail systems.
- Pedestrian access will be closed along one of the sidewalks during construction. Access will be maintained on the other side.
- Drivers, cyclists and pedestrians are asked to follow on-site signage and direction from on-site flaggers when temporary closures are in place.
- Information about ETS detours or service adjustments will be shared in advance, if required.
