Profiles

Chuck Isaacs

President of the Aboriginal Veterans Society of Alberta and retired Métis sergeant from the Canadian Armed Forces.

In 1992, Issacs was deployed as a combat engineer to the former Yugoslavia. Issacs left the military in 2001.

He now helps young Indigenous people wanting to get involved in the military and is the president of the Aboriginal Veterans Society of Alberta.

The Aboriginal Veterans Society of Alberta (AVSA) was founded by First Nation, Metis and Non - Status Veterans in 1983. Their mandate is to organize and unite all Aboriginal veterans for advocacy and support for each other and to facilitate activities such as the duties we undertake for other organizations who call upon us for parade and honouring assistance. Their goal is to honor all the Veterans who are still with us and those who have passed on to ensure future generations will know the contributions made by Aboriginal Veterans.

In addition to AVSA, Isaacs has been recruiting for the Bold Eagle program, which combines Indigenous culture and teachings with military training. A partnership between the Department of National Defence, First Nations and Aboriginal organizations from Western Canada, the Bold Eagle program includes a four day culture camp followed by a military recruit training course.

Colonel J. Paul de B. Taillon (Retd)

During his 30 service in the Canadian intelligence community, Dr. Taillon conducted intelligence and counter-terrorism/counter-intelligence operations. He was the first CSIS officer assigned to JTF-2. Dr. Taillon also served as an army reserve Colonel, and from 2006-2014, he was the strategic and counter-insurgency advisor to the Commander Canadian Army.

He has operational experience with American, Canadian, British forces in the latter case serving with The Parachute Regiment and the Special Air Service Regiment. He served in Oman, Bosnia, Kosovo, Ukraine and Afghanistan. He conducted 22 foreign Military Training Team (MTTs) missions under the auspices of US Special Operations Command (USSOCOM). He was the first CSIS officer assigned to JTF 2 and subsequently deployed in a military capacity with them to Afghanistan.

Dr. Taillon holds a PhD from the London School of Economics and Political Science, a Master of Arts in War Studies (Royal Military College of Canada), a Master of Arts in International Affairs (NPSIA Carleton University) and a Master of Arts in Strategic Studies (US Army War College). Dr. Taillon is an Adjunct Fellow at Joint Special Operations University in Tampa, Florida, and taught at Naval Post Graduate School in Monterey, California. He was on staff at the NATO Special Operations School in Chievres, Belgium, Directing Staff (DS) at CF Command and Staff College, Toronto, DS at the USMC Command and Staff College, Quantico Virginia, instructor at the National Defence University in Kiev, Adjunct Professor Royal Military College of Canada and is currently the Academic Advisor to Samuel Associates in Ottawa. He has published over 80 books and articles on terrorism, insurgencies, strategy, military operations, geostrategic issues, national security and military history.

He is the Honorary Colonel of The Canadian Grenadier Guards, is the Chairman of the Board of St John Federal District and is the Academic Advisor for Samuel Associates.

Biography

Brian Hodgson of Edmonton was an Intelligence Officer with the Canadian Security Intelligence Service (CSIS). He saw duty in the Service's Counter

Espionage, Counter Terrorism, and Security Screening Branches. He left CSIS in 1992 to become the Sergeant-at-Arms with the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, a position he held until 2019. He also served as the Assembly's Director of Visitor, Ceremonial, and Security Services and as the first president of the Canadian Association of Sergeants-at-Arms. Among his duties, he was responsible for the conception, planning, and execution of major events involving the Canadian Armed Forces and veterans on the grounds of the Legislature Building or within the Legislative Assembly Chamber.

Brian has a lifetime of Reserve Army service which included postings across Canada and in Germany. In 1979 he transferred from the Loyal Edmonton Regiment to the South Alberta Light Horse (Royal Canadian Armoured Corps). Commissioned from the rank of Sergeant in 1981, Lieutenant-Colonel Hodgson subsequently commanded his regiment, which is split between Edmonton Medicine Hat, from 1996 to 2000. In 2004 having taken leave from his employment with the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, he volunteered to deploy to Afghanistan, the first member of his regiment to do so. He continues to serve on the South Alberta Light Horse Regiment Foundation Board.

In prior service in the British Army, he saw operational tours in the Gordon Highlanders in Cyprus, Northern Ireland, and on Public Duties at The Castle, Edinburgh and HM The Queen's Guard, Balmoral in Scotland.

He is a graduate of the University of Alberta, the Sir William Stephenson Academy, the Canadian Forces Reserve Command and Staff College in Kingston, and of the Joint Reserve Command and Staff College in Toronto.

He is a past president of the Canadian Association of Sergeant at Arms, Edmonton Robert Burns' Club, and Edmonton Sir Winston Churchill Society and a former board member of the Edmonton United Services Institute, Churchill College Cambridge Scholarship Fund, the Canadian Aviation Hall of Fame Dinner Committee, HM The Queen's Golden and Diamond Jubilee Dinner Committees, the Vestry Committee of All Saints' Anglican Cathedral, Royal Canadian Armoured Corps (Cavalry) Association, the Capital Health Foundation and CARE Canada. He was formerly a member of the Edmonton Police Foundation, Alberta Association of Chiefs of Police, and Whitemud Equestrian Learning Centre Association. Currently, Brian is Chair of the Edmonton Salutes Committee, Salvation Army Edmonton Advisory Board, and Nancy Fairley Scholarship Fund. He was formerly on the boards of the Canada West Military Museums and the Northern Alberta Military Museum Initiative and was a Trustee for the Loyal Edmonton Regiment Museum.

At present, he is a long-time member of the Royal Canadian Legion AB-NWT Command Branch, the Loyal Edmonton Regiment Association and he is a Life Member South Alberta Light Horse Regimental Association.

In 2008 he was elected a Fellow Royal Canadian Geographical Society (FRCGS) and in 2009 was elected as a Governor (board member) of RCGS. In 2020 he was awarded the RCGS Joseph Bernier Medal. Brian also has received the Canada 125 Medal, HM The Queen Elizabeth's Golden, Diamond Jubilee, and Platinum Jubilee Medals, and the Alberta Centennial Medal.

He holds a skeleton sled competitors' license. A keen devotee of many forms of equestrian activity, he represented his regiment in international show-jumping competitions on numerous occasions. Brian is also a freelance writer. His numerous articles and book reviews have been published in the National Post, the Edmonton Journal, and the Calgary Herald.
