6.4.2 Budget Subcommittee	<ul> <li>S. Maybee provided an update of the latest Budget Subcommittee meeting and its recommendations regarding the Committee's funding of the Day Sail and selection criteria for the members, and the Military Cup Golf Tournament.</li> <li>It was recommended that the Committee funds up to 4 community members with the total expenses of approx. \$3200. Municipal and organization representatives are free to attend if selected and pay their own expenses</li> <li>The following criteria to select the community members was proposed: <ul> <li>no previous Day Sail experience and</li> <li>seniority on the committee.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

S. Lundy inquired whether the \$3200 sum covered the cost for all four members.

R. Parlin inquired if accommodations could be funded through the Wardroom to lower the costs. City Admin confirmed that the cost for the event was calculated based on the Wardroom's rates.

S. Maybee MOVED to approve the total funding of four community members of up to \$4,000 (in case the final cost exceeds the approved amount, S. Maybee and B. Hodgson to discuss further) and select those members based on their lack of previous involvement with Day Sail events and seniority serving on the Committee.
