# MFRC Yellow Ribbon Gala PROJECT FUNDING REQUEST

# 1. Executive Summary

The Yellow Ribbon was originally used by families when a loved one was returning home from overseas, and this tradition continues today. The yellow ribbon has become a well-known symbol showing support for military members and their families.

Our military is called upon to support people near and far, whether it is responding to natural disasters in Canada or supporting allies overseas. Absences from family support systems, difficulties during deployments, solo parenting, or coping with an injury or loss are realities for military families, which can significantly impact family well-being. The MFRC provides programs and services that enhance the strength and resilience of military families. Military family life comes with unique challenges, which is what makes programs offered by the MFRC such an integral part of ensuring families have the resources required to prosper.

In order to finance the wide variety of quality programs, the MFRC must raise funds. Our Annual Yellow Ribbon Gala Dinner and Silent Auction is not only our biggest annual fundraiser, but also a means to heighten public awareness about the importance of supporting military families – *The Strength Behind the Uniform*.

The year 2023 will mark the 17<sup>th</sup> year the MFRC has been hosting the Yellow Ribbon Gala Dinner. This dinner provides attendees with a unique formal mess dinner-style event with the opportunity to hear from a senior military leader, all while supporting the MFRC.

A Platinum Sponsorship of the Yellow Ribbon Gala Dinner and Silent Auction puts the Edmonton Salutes committee front and centre with the Edmonton military community. Supporting a charity that supports military and veteran families demonstrates your commitment to military families.

# 2. Purpose of Request

# • Description of project goals

The goal of our 17<sup>th</sup> Yellow Ribbon Gala and Silent Auction is to:

- Raise funds to enable the MFRC to continue to provide programs and services that our military families rely on in relocation – moving and settling into a new community; absences – support before, during, and after an absence; and transitions – moving into civilian life and becoming a veteran family.
- And heighten public awareness about the importance of supporting military families the Strength behind the Uniform.
- Timetable for implementation

After we close the project (April 22, 2023), we will add the total funds raised from sponsorship, donations, and silent auctions. The MRFC accounting team would then collate the total amount received. Funds raised go directly to support the programs and services provided to military and

veteran families.

# 3. Evaluation

The goal of the event to raise funds and increase awareness of the unique needs of military and veteran families. Our success criteria include the following:

- A 15% increase in public awareness about the MFRC and our services by the end of the year December 2023. We will measure this success by conducting post-event surveys, social media, and website analytics.
- Raise 15% (\$50,000) of the estimated fund development budget from sponsorship, donations, and silent auction at the 17th Yellow Ribbon Gala and Silent Auction slated for April 22, 2023.

# 4. Budget

We are requesting \$15,000 (platinum sponsorship). As the Edmonton Salutes Committee is a long term sponsor our priority would be for confirmation of the sponsorship to allow for appropriate sponsorship advertisement. Once confirmation of a sponsorship is received the actual funds would not be required until 15 April 2023. As a platinum sponsor, you will receive the following:

# 5. **Organization Information**

• Brief summary of the organization's history, programs, and accomplishments.

The Edmonton Garrison MFRC is the only local non-profit charitable organization nationally mandated as the frontline service provider to Canadian military families. For 33 years, the MFRC has been providing programs and services that enhance the strength and resilience of military families. We provide programs and services that our military families rely on in the areas of Mental Health and Wellness; Deployment Support; Child/Youth Development and Parenting Support; and Community Development and Integration.

The MFRC can help make a difference in the lives of military families, whether they are wishing to feel connected in a new community, looking for peer-support, seeking tools to cope during a deployment, living away from family support systems, solo parenting, or coping with an injury or loss.

Each of these key areas encompasses a variety of programs, services and events aimed at enhancing the strength and resilience of military families. An overview of these programs and services is listed below.

## Mental health and wellness services

When military family members are navigating difficult times, the MFRC provides confidential support by offering:

- Help finding resources
- Short-term counselling
- Crisis Support, including finding emergency childcare
- Assistance coping with an illness, injury, or death
- Preventative workshops and programs
- Assessment and Referral
- Veteran Family Program

#### **Deployment Support**

It's no secret that operational and training requirements often result in members of the Canadian Armed Forces being away from home. These absences could leave family members with extra responsibilities to juggle, along with the worries and emotions that they experience while a loved one is away. The MFRC offers readiness resources to help families prepare for an absence, peer-support programs, and help finding resources. A few of the services provide include:

- Pre- and Post-Deployment Workshops
- Family special events & activities
- Warm-line phone service
- Workshops and information sessions providing strategies to ease the stress of long separations

#### Child, youth, and parenting support

An element contributing to the health and well-being of military families is accessible support for the care and development of children and youth, as well as resources to encourage positive parenting. The MFRC supports parents in their care-giving role and provides opportunities for the healthy development of children and youth. Services include:

- Programs, services and special events for children and youth
- Parent education and support
- Support for families who have children with special needs
- Youth drop-in centre
- Emergency Family Care Assistance (EFCA)
- Deployment Child Care
- Casual Child Care
- Licensed, user funded, Day Care, Out of School Care and Playschool programs

#### Community development and integration

Each year, an average of 15,000 military members and their families move to a new home. 23% of military families have moved more than 4 times. The MFRC helps families settle into their new communities, through basic to complex resources such as finding a new

doctor, finding a job, and meeting new people. The MFRC also helps communities understand the challenges of military life, so families are better supported locally. Services include:

- Welcome and Community Orientation Service
- Information and Referral Services
- Community Outreach and Development
- Employment and Education Referral Service
- Relocation guides
- Help finding community services
- Pre-posting packages
- Language training
- Special Needs Information and Referral
- Organizational chart, including board, staff, and volunteer engagement
