## **Edmonton Salutes Remembrance Day Media Visits**

To help raise awareness for Edmonton Salutes, the Strategic Action Committee and the Finance Committee are suggesting a media tour of select media outlets on Friday, November 11<sup>th</sup> – Remembrance Day.

On that day, media outlets will be honoring our troops as they have in the past. However, they will also be looking for unique content to help populate their shows and draw in listeners or viewers.

By setting appointments in advance, we can arrange to send one Edmonton Salutes member and either a veteran, or a currently serving member of the Canadian forces to each location. While the military member can talk about the significance of Remembrance Day, and share some of their personal perspectives about serving for Canada, the Edmonton Salutes representative can talk about the future. What we do, and why it's important to support our military members and families within the community.

By timing our visits for Remembrance Day, we are providing the media with peerless content on the one day that they are guaranteed to be focused on the achievements and sacrifices of our brave soldiers.

With many radio outlets clustered in the same ownership facility, a single visit can easily be expanded to two or three stations in a single visit.

Based on the suggested plan below, we would require 7 Edmonton Salutes board members and 7 veterans or currently-serving members of the Canadian Forces to fulfill the schedule and truly blanket the city.

Obviously, we can also pick and choose which media outlets would provide Edmonton Salutes with the most exposure too and time on-air, and trim the schedule accordingly. Talk radio outlets like 630 CHED and the CBC are most likely to have extended discussions on-air, while other music-focused stations will run much shorter interviews (5-10 minutes maximum).

As these visits would come at no cost to the Edmonton Salutes board, it would just be a matter of populating each block with a two-person team, and developing key points in messaging that each team can deliver.

Best of all, this can become a recurring media event every Remembrance Day that pays the oappropriate honor to our troops, and helps raise awareness for Edmonton Salutes and its many valuable contributions.

Moving forward, a motion should be made to the Edmonton Salutes board asking if others see value in the media visits, and if others would be willing to raise a hand and host one of our scheduled visits on the morning of Friday, November 11<sup>th</sup>.

## Summary of Ask/Request to Edmonton Salutes Committee Members

- We will ask committee members to sign-up for interview times if interested and available.
- We will ask committee members to help identify veterans and active service members who are willing to sign-up for the interview schedule
- Those that volunteer for an interview will be given key messages they can reference

More instructions will follow once an interview is scheduled, including the time and location.

## **Suggested Media Outlets**
