- NSLA Dance to Remember
  - Budget Subcommittee recommended item for ESC consideration
  - L. Hackett noted ESC may want to consider contacting them in advance to remind them to apply for funding or a multi-year funding request
  - K. Principe asked if NSLA did not 0 receive the funding, would they be able to cover their expenses. B. Hodgson noted we did not ask for organizational financial information
  - B. Hodgson noted unique contribution - over 50 events in Edmonton metropolitan area, laying poppies at over 19K veteran's graves, 3,130 students at 31 schools involved, 750 volunteers
  - K. Principe suggested purchase of a table as opposed to full sponsorship and have military members attend with ESC members. Recognition would be by the military members, not printed materials
  - B. Hodgson noted the original request of \$7,500 was approved by the Budget Subcommittee.
  - R. Parlin asked if we are able to 0 support an event where the funds raised go to areas outside of Edmonton. B. Hodgson did ask NSLA if the ESC contribution would be used in the Edmonton Metro area and the answer was yes.
