

YEG Sew Days	Quilts of Valour Canada	The objective of the YEG Quilts of Valour group is ensure that enough quilts are available to fulfil the mandate of Quilts of Valour Canada, which is to support our injured military members, past and present with a quilt of comfort. Each quilt represents a warm hug from a grateful nation. The quilts are donated by individuals, by Quilt Guilds or by groups such as our YEG Quilts of Valour sew group. YEG Quilts of Valour consists of quilt makers, representatives, and presenters who connect with the nominated Veteran or Member and wrap them with a warm hug. We are requesting funding in the form of sponsorships to provide quilting materials to fulfill the mission. The sponsorship guarantees that quilting supplies come to Edmonton YEG sew group. Total Request: \$2000	Quilts of Valour Canada started in Edmonton in 2006 when Lezley Zwaal presented 3 quilts to injured Canadian Armed Forces members. By 2009 this became a National organization of volunteers who support injured members, past and present with a quilt of comfort. To date, Quilts of Valour Canada has presented 25,477 Quilts of Valour.
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
