Vision Zero Street Labs use adaptable measures to address traffic safety concerns on residential roads with local and collector traffic volumes. **Out-of-scope roads** for the High Park Street Lab are: 107 Avenue, 111 Avenue, 149 Street and 156 Street, as these are all high-volume arterial roads.
