Community Traffic Safety Concerns: What We Heard

Street Lab Plan

The Idylwylde Street Lab plan, which is outlined in the table below, has been designed to best improve safety and meet the needs of the community. The measures will be installed by the **end of October**, weather and resources permitting.

What We Heard Reported high speeds and a	Speed humps can help: √ Reduce excessive traffic volume.

What We're Installing

Rubber speed humps will be installed at:

- 86 Avenue between 83 Street and 79 Street
- ✓ Reduce excessive speeds on local roads.

Additional traffic calming measures are anticipated with the implementation of the Active Transportation Network Expansion Program along 79 Street (76 Avenue to 106 Avenue) and 84 Avenue (79 Street to 83 Street) in 2026. The program is intended to expand the City's active transportation network with routes that are safe, accessible and predictable for people of all ages and abilities.

The Street Lab will be evaluated **approximately three to six months** after installation. Neighbourhood residents will receive a public notice in the mail inviting participation in the evaluation survey. As these installations are adaptable, they may be adjusted based on evaluation learnings.
