Culture Moment

Culture Moment: Within the Whitemud Ravine and kihcihkaw askî, you may encounter "ribbon trees" adorned with fabric or other items. This is a meaningful tradition which reflects a deep connection between Indigenous people and the land and can be a way to offer a gift to the land, represent hopes and wishes, or remember deceased loved ones. These ribbons, which are typically made from cotton broadcloth, are intentionally left to naturally decompose within the ecosystem without causing harm to the trees. Upon seeing a ribbon tree, take a moment to reflect on your own family's relationship with the earth.
