Mill Creek Ravine Pedestrian Bridge and Trail Erosion Repair

The City of Edmonton will begin repairs on two bridges (B082 and B275) located within Mill Creek Ravine. The repairs will address trail erosion, ensuring the safe use and maintenance of these river valley bridges and trails. Construction is anticipated to begin the week of September 15 and is expected to be completed by the end of 2025.

Construction Details

- Construction beneath the 82 Avenue vehicle bridge (B082) includes erosion repairs, erosion protection and replacement of the drainage system below the bridge. A temporary closure of the west shared pathway located beneath the bridge will be required to complete this work.
- On the pedestrian bridge (B275) located within the ravine, construction includes erosion repairs and erosion protection.
- Landscaping work will be completed in spring 2026.
- Minimal traffic disruptions are expected as the work on B082 will occur under the bridge and will not require road closures.

Trail Access

Trail closures are expected during construction. The trails across B275 and under B082 will be closed for the duration of the project. A trail closure map is on the back of this bulletin.

Tree Removal

- Tree removals are required as part of this project. Removals are anticipated to begin in mid-September (weather permitting). Trees will be removed at both bridge sites.
- By working closely throughout the project, The City of Edmonton has minimized the number of trees removed and ensured that construction activities do not compromise the integrity of the retained trees and vegetation within the project boundary.
- City-owned trees are a highly valued asset and are only removed when all other preservation options are unsuitable. As part of the Urban Forest Management Plan, the City will plant new trees and shrubs in the project area once construction is complete.
