Financial Loss During Major Construction Projects Policy On October 4, 2023, a motion was passed for Administration to update a draft policy about "Financial Loss During Major Construction Projects" for consideration by City Council. The draft policy will focus on providing financial compensation to business owners, which will be repaid in years subsequent to construction completion should revenue increase to a level higher than pre-construction values. The draft policy is anticipated to be submitted to City Council for review in January 2024. 6 **MIP Construction Update** See presentation attached (below are key points) Drainage work starting this winter along 104 Ave (109 St to 107 St. and 121 St.) and SPR (123 St. to 129 St.) Stony Plain Road Bridge is still on track to open by fall 2024 Kajsa asked if the bridge will be opened to pedestrians at that time MIP shared that there are a couple options on the table for discussion: a) open bridge up to vehicles only (but not to pedestrians) as work will need to be completed when the weather is better or b) open the bridge completely, but will need to close it down again to do work Pedestrian access will be opened earliest in the summer Stony Plain Road (SPR): 129 St. to 139 st. Nov 2023 - reopening of Stony Plain Road with cross streets opened as well 134 St. cross street is now opened to accommodate businesses There will be no permanent paving (due to weather) on SPR Temporary pavement will mean that in 2024, MIP will come back to do permanent paving and waterproofing Permanent paving will be completed before the SPR bridge opens ■ Curb and gutter (the intense work) is now done, so permanent paving should go up fairly quickly There will be lane restrictions with the opening of SPR, however, vehicles will still be able to drive all the way down SPR Cross streets 134 St. cross street is now opened to accommodate businesses The temporary parking lot that was constructed for the 136 St. businesses will remain until the parkette is required to be built for the Glenora Stop Final configuration will mean that intersections will be right-in-right -out only with the exception of 132 St., 134 St, and 138 St. (which will
