	 Financial Loss During Major Construction Projects Policy On October 4, 2023, a motion was passed for Administration to update a draft policy about "Financial Loss During Major Construction Projects" for consideration by City Council. The draft policy will focus on providing financial compensation to business owners, which will be repaid in years subsequent to construction completion should revenue increase to a level higher than pre-construction values.  - o Video highlights the work that has been completed
- Construction Updates:
 - 159 St & 87 Ave intersection to remain in this configuration throughout the winter
 - Elevated Guideway construction continues. Span over 170 St will be complete soon.
 - The work is scheduled to occur overnight
 - Major considerations for the area include access for First Responders
 - Access to the Misericordia Hospital during construction is a top priority
 - Making great progress on both Misericordia & West Edmonton Mall Stations
 - o 182 St is expected to re-open by middle of November
 - Cross-over construction on Anthony Henday Dr to support LRT Bridge girder erection is complete.
 - Anthony Henday girder erection will occur this winter
 - SPR Girder install is currently underway to completed by end of November
 - SPR Bridge is inline to meet its deadline of November 2024 but is working the complete the work ahead of schedule
- MIP will continue to work until the weather makes continuation of work difficult due to safety concerns and quality control.

Questions/Discussion:

- Pam: The signage indicating closure of 170 Street for girder installation has been unclear. The road was closed when it was supposed to have been open.
 - Jenn S: Due to unforeseen circumstances, only one day's notice was provided ahead of work commencement, which is not typical of the usual amount of time provided ahead of closures (which is 5, 10, or 20 business days, depending on scope of work.)
 - The work will happen overnight

Sharon: Number of panhandlers has increased at major intersections along the LRT line Jasmine: They meander through the vehicles and slow down traffic ACTION ITEM: CWG members should submit concerns to LRTprojects@edmonton.ca	
 Mark: As CWG volunteers, it can be difficult to assess the best way to host meetings with stakeholders when they have passionate concerns. Should CWG members facilitate meetings with groups within the community to address major concerns? Wade: We are trying to create an environment as Sakeholder Relations that allows folks to ask questions and provide answers, vs. not giving them a direct line of communication with project leaders. Jasmine: It would be beneficial to have a working group meeting and host multiple communities at a time to encourage more perspectives Mark: A meeting should be arranged in the Spring and provide plenty of advanced notice to meet community members. ACTION ITEM: Mark and Jenn S to work together to coordinate a meeting in the Spring. 	
 Pam: Signage indicating closures are not always placed in visible locations. Jenn S: All sign placement follows traffic accommodation requests, which is coordinated with the City of Edmonton Traffic Operations Team. There are many factors that are taken into consideration in sign placement. No action required. 	

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- Mark: At some point, both access points to Aldergrove will be closed.
 Some residents are concerned about emergency access, and he relays information regarding MIP's prioritization of emergency access points.
 - Pam: These closures will lead to traffic increases in front of
 Thorncliff school, police enforcement should be made a priority.
- ➤ For consideration: MIP is not responsible for police enforcement. Residents are encouraged to speak with principals and ask them to contact their EPS contacts for enforcement.
 - Pam: Some lights on the construction sites are not pointed away from incoming traffic and can be blinding to drivers.

ACTION ITEM: Pam to send an email that specifies the exact location/intersection of the problematic lights.

- Mark: Regarding 189 Street and 87 Ave:
 - Would it be possible to have a local-traffic only request on 95 Ave?
 - Lots of commuter traffic
 - Accessing the Henday driving up 95 Ave turning left onto 189 Street and then turning right onto 87 Ave to avoid traffic on 170 and 178 Street
 - Functionally, this means residents can't leave the community during rush hour as they cannot turn left
 - Residents have to drive straight through, turn left onto businesses and then exit on the right

ACTION ITEM: Mark to submit an email to MIP with the details of intersection. A sign can be installed once details are provided.

- ➤ For consideration: Any request for signage that's not directly along the alignment becomes a matter for the City. Concerns can be sent to LRTprojects@edmonton.ca
 - Jasmine: Is it possible to request that signs be placed outside of the school just off the alignment?
 - o MIP only provides signage along the LRT alignment.

ACTION ITEM: Jasmine to submit an email to LRTprojects@edmonton.ca with the details of intersection. A sign can be installed once details are provided.

- Jasmine: Would like some "Local-Traffic Only" signs to deter people from cutting across 178 St, 187 St and 189 St.
 - Would like some "local traffic only" signs

ACTION ITEM: Jasmine to submit an email to LRTprojects@edmonton.ca with the details of intersection. A sign can be installed once details are

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provided.

- Sharon: Has a poor experience with worker vehicles blocking access
 - Was told they'd only be there for a few minutes. Blocked in resident for an extended period of time when the resident had to catch a flight.
- ➤ No action required.
 - Sharon: There was a workplace injury and residents wanted an update on the worker
 - MIP issued a statement on social media and to the media to address the matter
 - Unfortunately, the worker lost a leg
 - Worker has since returned to work.
- ➤ No action required.
 - Rusk: On 95 headed East to West on 170th, there are no left-right turning lights. This causes backed-up traffic.
 - The intersection in question is not along the main VLW line.

ACTION ITEM: Citizens should submit the concern via 311, who will send it directly to Traffic Ops to address it.

- Rusk: The new pedestrian pathway from Wem to the Misericordia
 Hospital features rocks that are big enough to take over the pedestrian
 walkway and drop it onto traffic.
 - This has not happened yet, but citizen is concerned that it will occur in future.

ACTION ITEM: Meilai will raise this issue with the right contact as this is a capital project, not a VLW project.

➤ For future consideration: Community members have been instructed to submit inquiries via main LRT email at <u>LRTprojects@edmonton.ca</u> for immediate response rather than waiting for CWG meetings to raise issues.
