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Ready-to-Cover Inspection

This inspection is an interim inspection to review work before it is covered up with gypsum board or other concealing materials. All trade rough-in inspections should be completed before requesting this inspection.

Check - Secondary Suite

The following are the most common items audited during this inspection. However, the list is not exhaustive. The work must meet all the applicable codes and standards.

Construction matches the <u>Secondary Suite Design Guide</u>
Permanent access is provided per <u>B19-04 Small Building Access Policy</u>
Adequate egress through halls, stairs and landings
Sleeping room have egress windows
Stairs must have: continuous handrail proper rise/run adequate headroom
Smoke alarm and carbon monoxide alarm locations (not yet installed)
Any structural work (e.g., window openings, column or bearing wall modification, etc.); and
Sound protection provisions, per chosen compliance path at the time of permit application,
including resilient channel (when using).
Mechanical rooms must be finished on the interior:
continuous gypsum board installed on all walls and ceilings
☐ firestopping of all seams, gaps and penetrations.

Check - Home Renovation, Basement or Addition

The following are the most common items audited during this inspection. However, the list is not		
exhaustive. The work must meet all the applicable codes and standards.		
	Any site-framed floors, walls, roofs & beams are exposed	
	Insulation and Vapour Barrier are installed and sealed.	
REMINDER: Areas and surfaces requiring trades rough-in inspections may not be covered until		
successfully inspected.
