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
What's changing?

Soon, your building will have food scraps and recycling collection!

Please put recycling in your building's blue bin and food scraps in your green bin or cart.



Getting **started**



Step 1: Set up your space

Find a place for your food scraps pail, like on your counter or under your sink. This makes it easy to collect scraps. You can line your pail with any bag (paper or plastic).

Find a place to store recyclables.

A blue bag or old box will work.



Step 2: Post your What Goes Where poster


It's best in a handy spot, like on your fridge. Use it to help sort waste. If you can't find your waste item, look it up on the WasteWise app (see back cover).



Step 3: Start sorting!

When your containers are full, empty them in your building's correct bin or cart. Your recyclables can be loose or in blue bags.

Tip: Your food scraps pail is dishwasher safe! To minimize odours, wash it regularly.








Recyclables are sorted and sent to manufacturers, who turn them into new products. This saves natural resources, conserves energy and reduces emissions.



Food scraps are composted. This keeps them out of landfills, where they would produce greenhouse gasses as they break down.


Be a good neighbour



Don't leave items outside of bins


Bins won't be emptied if garbage bags are left beside or in front of them. They block access for the collection trucks.

Properly sorting food scraps and recycling saves space in your garbage bin.



Flatten cardboard boxes


This saves space in the blue bin. Unfolded boxes take up to ten times as much space!



Take bulky items to Eco Stations


