Some paths at the Zoo have twists and turns. Some paths at the Zoo have small hills or inclines. I can take a break on the benches found along the trail if I want.



There are three water bottle refill stations in the Zoo. One is near the Entry Plaza washrooms, one is in the Edventure Lodge and one is in Saito Centre.



I may see animals along the pathways of the Zoo, like squirrels and geese, that are not Zoo animals. I will not try to touch them because it is not safe to touch the animals.
