


Welcome to 103 Avenue Streetscape Project

We want to hear from YOU! Tell us about the POSSIBILITIES and POTENTIAL that you envision for 103 Avenue.










Project Background

103 Avenue Streetscape is a **Walkable** project. This will make the area more attractive to live and invest in, bringing more diversity, vibrancy, and energy to downtown Edmonton. This is a component of the **Capital City Downtown Plan** that calls for improvements to downtown roadways and streetscapes that support safe and comfortable pedestrian movement, sidewalk vibrancy, quality urban design, and more trees and greenery. 






An Alley Opportunity

The **ALLEY** between Churchill Revera and Sutton Place Hotel is part of the 103 Avenue Streetscape Project.






