

SPECIAL BYLAW REQUIREMENTS IN THE CITY OF EDMONTON

PERMIT REQUIREMENTS FOR OVERWEIGHT AND OVERDIMENSIONAL LOADS:

(Excepts Only - for full text, refer to the Traffic Bylaw #5590 document.)
BANNED USE OF ENGINE RETARDER BRAKES
 The City of Edmonton's Noise Bylaw #7255 Section 310 states that no operator of any vehicle is allowed to engage their engine retarder brakes within the city limits. The fine for this offence is \$250.

Before entering the city of Edmonton, you must obtain a City of Edmonton "PERMIT TO MOVE" as required by the City of Edmonton Traffic Bylaw #5590, Section 212. A Province of Alberta Motor Transport Services (MTS) permit is not valid in the city of Edmonton.

An overweight permit is needed if an indivisible load exceeds the legal weight allowed per axle or axle group. Yearly Over Dimensional (O.D.) permits are issued at a minimum \$15 fee each when a copy of the yearly O.D. Provincial permit is sent in, faxed or delivered to our weekday office.

91 - Vehicles With Loads (Securing/Tarping Loads)

(1) A person shall not operate a vehicle on a highway with any loose material on the exterior of the vehicle.
 (2) A person shall not operate a vehicle containing any load on a highway unless the load has been secured in accordance with any part of it from falling onto the highway.
 (3) Without limiting the generality of subsection (2), a person shall not operate a vehicle containing a load of earth, sand, gravel or other loose material on a highway unless:
 (a) all parts of the load are at least 75 millimetres below the top of the container; and
 (b) the container and load are completely covered at all times.
 (4) In the event any part of a load falls onto a highway from a vehicle the person operating the vehicle shall forthwith:
 (a) take all reasonable steps to safely remove any material from the highway; and
 (b) notify both the City and the Edmonton Police Service.
 (5) In the event any part of a load falls onto a highway from a vehicle the person operating the vehicle shall forthwith:
 (a) take all reasonable steps to safely remove any material from the highway; and
 (b) notify both the City and the Edmonton Police Service.
 (6) In the event any part of a load falls onto a highway from a vehicle the person operating the vehicle shall forthwith:
 (a) take all reasonable steps to safely remove any material from the highway; and
 (b) notify both the City and the Edmonton Police Service.

85 - Slow Moving Vehicles

(1) For the purposes of this section a slow moving vehicle means:
 (a) an animal or an animal drawn vehicle;
 (b) a piece of machinery or equipment designed for use at a speed not exceeding 40 kilometres per hour; or
 (c) any motor vehicle travelling substantially less than the normal speed of the traffic on the highway at that time and place and under the conditions then existing.

(2) A person shall not operate a slow moving vehicle on a highway designated as prohibiting such vehicles.
 (3) Subsection (2) only applies weekdays between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.
 (4) A person shall not operate a slow moving vehicle at night on a highway with a maximum speed of 80 kilometres per hour or more unless the slow moving vehicle is accompanied by an escort vehicle following a safe distance behind.

92 - Dangerous Goods Routes And Permits

Unless otherwise permitted by this bylaw a person shall not transport any dangerous goods on a highway unless:
 (a) the highway is designated as a dangerous goods route; or
 (b) a permit authorizing the transportation of the dangerous goods is used as issued by the City.

93 - Exceptions

(1) Subject to subsection (2) a permit is required to transport dangerous goods on a highway other than a dangerous goods route:
 (a) within an industrial area for the purpose of:
 (i) travelling to or from a permitted vehicle storage location; or
 (ii) delivering dangerous goods to or collecting dangerous goods from one or more locations; provided that the most direct and practical route to and from the dangerous goods route and between locations is followed;
 (b) within a non-industrial area for the purpose of:
 (i) travelling to or from a permitted vehicle storage location; or
 (ii) delivering dangerous goods to or collecting dangerous goods from one or more locations; provided that the most direct and practical route to and from the dangerous goods route and between locations is followed;
 (c) if the distance between one location and the next destination exceeds the distance between the location and a dangerous goods route then a person shall not travel directly between locations and shall return to the dangerous goods route.
 (2) This section does not permit a person to transport dangerous goods on a highway designated as a prohibited dangerous goods route.

94 - No Stopping

(1) A person transporting dangerous goods shall not stop within the City except:
 (a) at a permitted vehicle storage location;
 (b) to deliver or collect the dangerous goods;
 (c) in compliance with directions from a peace officer or a traffic control device; or
 (d) in the event of a mechanical failure of the vehicle, a release of any dangerous good or some other emergency.
 (2) If a person transporting Class 1 (Explosives) dangerous goods stops within the City pursuant to subsection (1)(a) then that person shall obtain a permit issued by the City prior to stopping at a permitted vehicle storage location.
 (3) If a person transporting dangerous goods stops within the City pursuant to subsection (1)(b) then that person shall forthwith notify the City as well as the Edmonton Police Service.

95 - Core Area Transportation

(1) A person shall not transport dangerous goods on a highway within a core area of the City except:
 (a) to deliver or collect only Class 3 (Flammable Liquid) dangerous goods between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. the following day in a vehicle having four or fewer axles;
 (b) to deliver or collect any dangerous goods other than Class 3 (Flammable Liquid) between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. the following day in a vehicle having a maximum gross weight less than 19,000 kilograms; or
 (c) pursuant to a permit issued by the City authorizing the transportation of dangerous goods within a core area of the City.

DANGEROUS GOODS PERMITS:

Special permits for the movement of dangerous goods can be obtained from the Fire Marshal by telephoning 780-496-3628.
PENALTIES:
 Persons operating vehicles in violation of the Traffic Bylaw #5590 are subject to penalties of \$500.00 or more.

89 - Overweight Vehicle

(1) A person shall not operate an overweight vehicle on a highway unless a permit has been issued by the City.
 (2) A permit used to operate an overweight vehicle shall be:
 (a) valid and subsisting;
 (b) in the possession of any person operating the overweight vehicle; and
 (c) produced forthwith to a peace officer on demand.
 (3) A person operating an overweight vehicle on a highway pursuant to a permit shall comply with all terms and conditions of the permit.
 (4) The fees for a permit used to operate an overweight vehicle are calculated as follows:

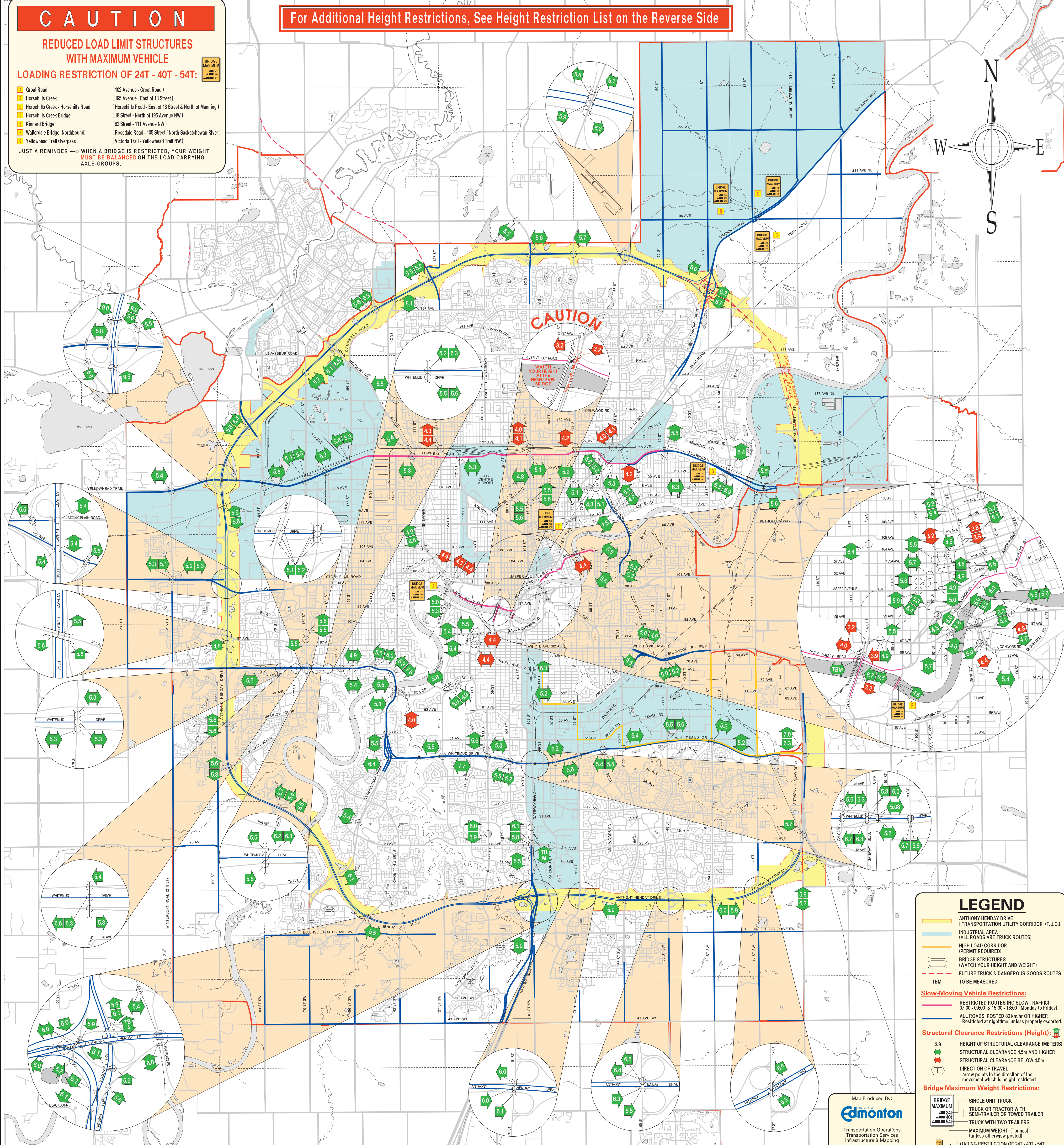
