The Building Great Neighbourhoods and Open Spaces Branch of the City of Edmonton is responsible for renewing aging infrastructure in Edmonton's neighbourhoods. Beginning in 2023, Ottewell will undergo neighbourhood renewal. The Neighbourhood Renewal program will rehabilitate roads, curbs and gutters, replace street lights, repair sidewalks and connect missing sidewalk links where possible. Other opportunities to improve parks and public spaces will be explored.



The City values public input and recognizes its importance in identifying the needs of Ottewell area residents and businesses. Although all in–person engagement sessions have been put on hold to follow the physical distancing requirements currently in place due to COVID–19, we value your input. Throughout the project, we will be using a variety of unique online methods to provide you with many opportunities to help shape the Ottewell renewal.

We are looking for ideas related to four themes: connectivity/accessibility, neighbourhood parks and open spaces, safety and placemaking. What can we do with a Project Vision?

A vision is a short description that sets the direction on where the community would like to see livability and mobility in the future. Important elements are identified for the City's work on roads, sidewalks, curbs, street lights and outdoor public spaces. These elements tell us the most important things to look at when we create plans to renew your neighbourhood.

We need your help to **CREATE** the neighbourhood renewal project vision. The vision, along with understanding the important elements for the renewal, will help inform a design for your neighbourhood and be used over the project lifecycle for priority setting and decision making.

Now is the time to get involved!

Planning begins now for a neighbourhood design that will be constructed starting in 2023. Get involved early to share what is important to you and what changes you would like to see. This helps ensure the renewal outcome meets your needs and those of your neighbours. Start thinking about how you move, work, live and play in Ottewell and how you would like to in the future. New infrastructure will be in place for the next 30 to 50 years.

A series of engagement events and activities will give you the opportunity to provide input into this project and share your ideas with the project team.



How decisions are made

City policies and programs such as the Complete Streets Design and Construction Standards, Vision Zero Edmonton and Winter City Strategy provide the overall direction for Neighbourhood Renewal designs. As each neighbourhood is unique, the Project Team asks for input from residents who live, work and play in the neighbourhood and considers technical aspects such as roadway widths and conflicts with utilities and trees to determine what will fit in the neighbourhood.
