What is Neighbourhood Renewal?

- + The Neighbourhood Renewal program is part of the Building Great Neighbourhoods and Open Spaces Branch.
- + The program:
 - + Renews and rebuilds roads, sidewalks and street lights in mature neighbourhoods
- Neighbourhood Renewal is delivered in coordination with other City departments and projects in the area.
- + Through coordination we can also improve other elements including intersection safety, pedestrian and bike connections, and parks and and green spaces



What's Included

Infrastructure upgrades:

- Regrading and paving of local and collector roads*
- Replacing sidewalks**
- Replacing street lights
- Construct new sidewalks,
 where missing

Other potential elements:

- Implementing connections that help people move (walk, bike, drive, transit)
- Making improvements to green spaces/parks (trees, furniture, beautification)
- Mitigating neighbourhood traffic issues
- Upgrading to decorative street lights**
- Reviewing signal timing and crossings on arterial roads








Pleasantview Age Distribution: 2016 Census


Pleasantview Journey to Work: 2016 Census
