#### Re: City Heritage Building Inventory

Dear Mayor Iveson and Councillors,

The Edmonton Historical Board (EHB) is an advisory board for the City Council of Edmonton, providing information and recommendations relating to Edmonton's history generally and specifically in reference to the city's built heritage. One of the regular recommendations made by the Board to Council is the addition of buildings or properties to the Cit/s Inventory of Historic Resources.

The EHB is aware that the Executive Committee is receiving the Administration report on the City Heritage Building Inventory. The EHB believes that the City has a duty of care regarding city-owned historical buildings, such that the City is obligated to set the best possible example when it comes to the preservation and protection of historical assets. As such, historic buildings, monuments and historical fragments that are city-owned should automatically be considered for inclusion on the Heritage Inventory.

We strongly believe that inclusion on the Heritage Inventory, at a minimum, should be considered for any potential city-owned asset. Consideration when a new asset is purchased could prevent such occurrences as did recently with the Graphic Arts Building.

Additionally, the EHB would strongly recommend that we be consulted during Administrative discussions regarding the disposition of city-owned historical assets which are included on the Inventory or are Designated Municipal Resources. Despite the Mitchell & Reed Auction House ("the Artery"] being on the Inventory, we believe no pause was taken before Administration opted to recommend demolishing the building. Had the EHB been consulted, we could have offered our expertise in the historical significance of either building before demolition was Considered.

Furthermore, we believe it is important for the City Council to consider which City-Owned Heritage Building Assets have not been included in the Attachment to the current report. We believe there maybe historic resources which are neither Designated or on the Heritage Inventory, which have been excluded from this listing. It is imperative that the entire listing of city-owned assets be carefully reviewed to determine if historical assets exist within the City's current holdings.

Finally, the Edmonton Historical Board supports the recommendation to develop a "City-Owned Historic Resource Management Strategy"; and we would offer our expertise during the development of this plan. We believe we can provide specific expertise, and are well-positioned as an Advisory Board to offer support and advice on matters of City-Owned Heritage Building Assets.

## HERITAGE PLANNERS' REPORT Report to the Edmonton Historical Board April 27, 2016

Glenora Neighbourhood Historic Resources Inventory Phase II: Second batch of historic resources was presented to the Panel on April 12<sup>th</sup>. For the month of May, there are two scheduled meetings to review and evaluate the third and fourth batches of historic resources.

Designation Bylaw to designate the William Lowes Residence (Strathcona), and Cameron Block (Chinatown) were passed by City Council on April 19<sup>th</sup>

Bylaw to Designate the Phyllis Grocery (Church Street) is scheduled for City Council on May 3<sup>th</sup>.

Notice of Intention to Designate the Duncan Cameron Residence is scheduled for Executive Committee on May 10<sup>th</sup> and then to City Council on May 24<sup>th</sup>.

Notice of Intention to Designate the Emery Residence in Garneau is scheduled for Executive Committee on July 5<sup>th</sup> and then to City Council on July 12<sup>th</sup>.

McDougall Church Restoration Committee is working closely with Group 2 Architecture (Allan Partridge) as their architect on reviewing the submissions from general contractors.

The Heritage Unit continues their dialogue with representatives to designate St. Joseph's Basilica, St. Joachim's Church and First Baptist Church.

Design work continues on the restoration of the Queen Elizabeth Planetarium. David Murray Architect has also been retained as the heritage consulting architect on the project. The City is also in the process of including the mosaics of the zodiac that are on the walkways as part of the restoration work.

The Heritage Unit has submitted an application to City Wide Planning to rezone Church St to a DC1 to reinforce its special character. Public meetings on the DC1 rezoning will be scheduled for Fall 2016.

The review of the Historic Resource Management Plan (HRMP): The Heritage Management Unit has determined that we need to hire a consultant to conduct the review of the HRMP and carry out the public consultation process and possibly host workshops, etc. Our Chief Planner, Peter Ohm, has received a briefing on our proposal to retain a consultant and has asked that we present to the Directors of the City Planning Branch, the why, how, when and what. At this time we estimate it will take 18 months to complete.

On April 19<sup>th</sup>, a report on City Owned Historic Resources Inventory was received by City Council. Your April 8<sup>th</sup> letter was referenced by Councillor Henderson on your request that EHB would like to have input in the process of the preparing a City Owned Historic Resource Management Strategy, that other city owned building may have heritage value, and your concerns about the Artery and Graphic Arts Building. This report from Integrated Infrastructure Services (a new City Branch) was to inform Council on the condition of 57 City owned historical assets; 9 are cemeteries and monuments. 48 are buildings. Twenty-seven (27) of the 48 buildings were assessed and of these, 12 are in good condition, 10 are in fair condition and 5 are poor condition. Of the 21 buildings without a recent condition assessment, 8 buildings do not require one as they have been renovated or secured in recent years. The 13 buildings without detailed condition assessment reports are regularly monitored but have not been assessed in the last 5 years. Integrated Infrastructure Services has plans to complete the balance of building assessments in time for the 2019-22 Building and Capital Rehabilitation capital program. They have prioritized the assessments for the designated historic resources that are in poor condition.

Also, the motion on this item was generated from the verbal report on the Artery Buildings, which was also discussed at City Council and Mr. Trocenko stated that Mr. Chris Hodgson will meet with EHB to discuss the public offering of the Artery and the Graphic Arts building prior to its release.

This Old Edmonton House Seminar Series is now finished for this year. We had a few cancelled courses. Overall, we are satisfied on how it went considering the seminar series was cancelled in 2015. In late August we will begin to plan for the courses for 2017.

7. On May 1, I'll be attending the launch of a book called From Generation to Generation: Jewish Edmontonians as Heritage Builders at Audrey's Books.

8. On May 7, I'll be attending the Heritage Fair and the Ben Calf Robe school pow wow.
