

Redevelopment Plan Update

Draft Development Concepts

Since we held the Public Ideas Review event in June, the project team has been working to incorporate the ideas gathered into a series of development concepts. The input gathered on the ideas in June was weighed against the guiding principles, issues and opportunities, best practices in urban planning, and market feasibility in order to prepare these concepts. We met with community and industry stakeholders to discuss the early versions of the concepts and get some initial feedback.

We would like to walk you through the process and have your input on these draft concepts at the upcoming September 18 event.

The event is being hosted as part of the City of Edmonton's Neighbourhood Renewal program for mature neighbourhoods. Planning is underway for the Highlands neighbourhood, which will see the replacement of its aging collector and local roadway surfaces, street lights and sidewalks beginning in 2019 and ending in 2021.
