

Truck Driver III

DEFINITION

Employees of this class operate and are responsible for a truck and auxiliary equipment rated with an Alberta Government licensed gross vehicle weight in excess of 13 000 kg (30 000 lbs) GVW. This may involve pulling a trailer having a GVW of less than 4 600 kg (10 000 lbs). Assignments include performing routine labouring work and incidental clerical work. In addition, incumbents may be expected to perform routine maintenance of vehicles or equipment.

TYPICAL DUTIES*

Delivers men, materials, equipment or parts to field crews, loads and moves equipment between work sites, picks up parts and materials from vendors, warehouses or City stockyards.

Loads and unloads materials either manually or with the assistance of a power tailgate or forklift.

Performs routine maintenance duties such as cleaning the truck box, cleaning up at the work site, routine maintenance of vehicles and equipment.

Performs related work as required.

KNOWLEDGE, ABILITIES AND SKILLS

Ability to drive a truck rated in the designated weight range.

Ability to secure the applicable Alberta vehicle operator's licence and a City Driver's Permit.

Ability to understand and execute oral and written instructions.

Physical strength and agility sufficient to perform work of this class.

TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS

Job Level

Completion of the eighth school grade supplemented by experience in the operation of vehicles assigned to the position or equivalent combination of training and experience. Possession of a valid Alberta Class 3 motor vehicle operator's licence.
