Truck Driver IV

DEFINITION

Employees of this class operate and are responsible for a truck, auxiliary equipment and trailer combination where the combined Alberta licensed gross vehicle weight exceeds 13 600 kg (10 000 lbs). Assignments include performing routine labouring work and incidental clerical work. In addition, incumbents may be expected to perform routine maintenance on either the truck or equipment located at the work site.

TYPICAL DUTIES*

Picks up and delivers materials from loading sites.

Loads and hauls vehicles or equipment between work sites or repair facilities.

Loads and unloads materials either manually or with the assistance of a forklift.

Performs routine maintenance and servicing duties such as; cleaning the truck box, cleaning up at the work site, routine servicing and maintenance of the truck and plant equipment.

Performs related work as required.

KNOWLEDGE, ABILITIES AND SKILLS

Ability to drive a truck rated in the designated weight range.

Ability to secure the applicable Alberta vehicle operator's license and a City Driver's Permit.

Ability to understand and execute oral and written instructions.

Physical strength and agility sufficient to perform work of this class.

TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS

Job Level

Completion of the eight school grade supplemented by experience in the operation of vehicles assigned to the position or equivalent combination of training and experience. Possession of a valid Alberta Class 1 motor vehicle operator's license and airbrake certification.
