132 Avenue Renewal Project Update - January 2022

132 Avenue between Fort Road and 127 Street has been selected for Collector Renewal with construction anticipated to start in 2023. Collector Renewal will rehabilitate the road and sidewalks, add missing sidewalk links, and replace street lights. We will also explore ways to improve how people walk, bike, drive and gather in and around 132 Avenue has also been explored.

The City is currently working on a plan to renew the section of 132 Avenue connecting the neighbourhoods of Belvedere, Delwood, Balwin, Glengarry, Killarney, Rosslyn, Lauderdale, Kensington and Calder. Cost sharing opportunities will be made available through the Local Improvement process for sidewalk reconstruction and street light upgrades. The 132 Avenue Renewal project will also align with other City strategies, projects and programs, such as the Edmonton Bike Plan and Speed Limit Reduction.

This newsletter provides updates on the renewal of 132 Avenue and highlights details on when and how you can join the conversation.

We will continue to invite you to participate in a variety of ways, will share what we hear from you and your neighbours, and will demonstrate how the information was used to inform the draft and final design.

DRAFT DESIGN FOR 132 AVENUE

Since the launch of 132 Avenue's Collector Renewal project in September 2020, the Project Team has been gathering local knowledge, gaining an understanding of technical constraints such as the location of various underground utilities, exploring opportunities and reviewing City policies and programs. The previous stage in the project, **Exploring Options and Tradeoffs**, led to feedback that informed the development of a draft design for 132 Avenue that we are now ready to share with you. How we created the draft design

The project team reviewed all the input provided at the **Exploring Options and Tradeoffs** stage and created draft designs based on public input, technical feasibility and City policies/programs. You can read the full **What We Heard** report on our project website at <u>edmonton.ca/132Avenue</u> for the **Exploring Options and Tradeoffs** stage. Options were shown with the following themes: driving, service roads, traffic calming (measures used to slow traffic), walking, biking, parking, gathering spaces and community features. During the draft design stage, we took each of the themed options and placed them in the overall design to ensure they fit together as a system along 132 Avenue. These draft design options have also been reviewed for alignment with the Vision and Guiding Principles, to ensure the improvements will help shape the future of 132 Avenue.

HOW DECISIONS ARE MADE

The City makes Collector Renewal decisions using a combination of policy and program direction, public engagement input and technical requirements

City policies and programs such as the Complete Streets Design and Construction Standards, Safe Mobility Strategy and Winter City Strategy provide the overall direction for Collector Renewal designs. The Project Team asks for input from residents and considers technical aspects such as roadway widths and conflicts with utilities and trees to determine what will fit in the neighbourhood.
