Phase 2: 114 Street to 124 Street

Edmonton

Construction begins in spring 2026

The City of Edmonton is continuing work on Imagine Jasper Avenue. Construction on 117 Street to 121 Street will begin this spring. This work follows the same design used in Phase 1 (109 to 114 Street), which was completed in 2022 and builds on the improvements completed between 114 Street and 117 Street in 2025. This marks the second year of construction for Phase 2.

Though construction will require temporary lane, road and sidewalk closures, as well as parking restrictions, one lane of traffic will be maintained in each direction along the entire corridor at all times. Pedestrian access will be maintained.

What to expect in 2026

114 Street to 117 Street

Work in this area will be limited to landscaping and final paving.

117 Street to 121 Street

Full roadway and sidewalk reconstruction will begin in April. Construction will start on the north side of Jasper Avenue, with construction on the south side to follow.

This staged approach helps maintain access and manage construction impacts. Construction in this area is expected to be completed in late 2026, with Jasper Avenue reopening to full capacity for the winter.

121 Street to 124 Street

In 2026, utility relocation is underway in preparation for future streetscape improvements. Gas utilities will move from under the sidewalk into the roadway. Utilities currently located overhead on wooden poles will be relocated underground to support the long-term vision for Jasper Avenue. Utility work includes power, water, gas and telecommunications infrastructure relocations and/or installations.

- + Water main relocations and upgrades will begin in April, starting on the north side of Jasper Avenue.
- + Work to relocate power and telecommunications utilities underground will follow, and then move to the south side of Jasper Avenue. This work will continue into the winter months.
- + Telecommunications crews will also install new underground vaults within the roadway.
- + Utility relocations will be coordinated, where possible, and include updates to building service connections.
- + Some utility work will also occur west of 124 Street to connect new infrastructure to existing systems.

The City is committed to ensuring access to businesses and residences is maintained throughout the construction period. Construction areas will be fenced and marked as restricted.

We appreciate your patience while the work is underway. Please travel carefully and follow all posted signage.

Utility Outages and Building Coordination

Temporary utility outages may be required at times along the corridor. Affected customers will be notified directly by the respective utility companies in advance of any planned outages, including the need for temporary water service, through construction bulletins.

Any work required on private property or within individual buildings will be coordinated directly between the utility companies and building owners or managers. Residents and businesses are encouraged to contact their building manager for more information.

More detailed construction updates, including timing and access information, will be shared as work progresses.

Noise

Construction work will comply with the City's Community Standards Bylaw for noise control. If it is necessary to temporarily exceed acceptable noise levels, necessary permits will be obtained.
